



Flooding Pursers Lane, Peaslake – this issue has been raised again with Surrey County Council. Surrey County Council (SCC) and Guildford Borough Council (GBC) Councillor B Hughes has reiterated that he has asked Surrey Highway Engineers, to identify the issue and formulate a deliverable engineering plan, to stop the constant flooding. It was stressed to Councillor B Hughes that the flooding and the appalling potholes (especially on Hoe Lane), were making it increasingly difficult for residents to get in or out of Peaslake. Councillor B Hughes encouraged all residents to report the potholes via fix my street on the Surrey County Council website and to let him know if they were not repaired within the expected timeframe. Holmbury St Mary Traffic – SCC & GBC Councillor B Hughes has reported that more traffic surveys were planned for Holmbury St Mary and the data would be reviewed alongside the volunteer speed watch data.

Open Gardens, Shere – Shere Parish Council has approved free parking for the day in the main car park for people with a disability. Please ensure your car registration details are given to one of the volunteer marshals on the day to ensure your details are uploaded to Ocean Parking (the car park operator).

Extension of 20mph limit to Gomshall - although the speed limit for the main A25 through Gomshall will remain the same, a 20mph limit will be applied in March to the roads south of the A25. This should improve safety on Goose Green and Queen Street which are particularly dangerous and brings Gomshall in line with Shere and Peaslake.

CCTV upgrade in Shere Recreation Ground Car Park – two new night vision cameras are going to be installed in the car park to improve safety and discourage people driving onto the field at night.

Pond Lane Car Park – resurfacing is being considered by the council. If agreed the surface will be resurfaced with a new permeable tarmac and will be maintenance free for the next 15 plus years. A new French drain would also be installed to improve surface water management. The cost however is considerable and if agreed, the project will be managed and budgeted for alongside the council's other major projects.

New Notice Board for Holmbury St Mary – the council has approved a new, like for like, notice board to replace the old and leaning notice board outside the church in Holmbury St Mary. The existing board has been in place since the 1950s and it is hoped the new one will look just as lovely for many decades.

New Meeting dates – the meetings dates for May 2026 –to April 2027 are now agreed and available on the website.

Next Full Council meeting – Full Council Meeting 7.30pm Thursday March 5, 2026, at Peaslake Village Hall Walking Bottom, Peaslake GU5 9RR.

All meetings are open to the public and there is an opportunity at every council meeting for members of the public to address the councillors.
